Issues Covered: Premature Births, Birth Defects, Zika Virus, Education and Environmental Issues.

Guests: Misty Whitchurch, Brett Jackson and Carmen Branch with the March of Dimes North Texas; Debbie Branch and Raymond Lister with the City of Fort Worth.

Topic: The March of Dimes North Texas is gearing up for their annual March for Babies on Saturday, April 16th at White Rock Lake in Dallas, the event raises awareness about the work that the March of Dimes does to help prevent premature births and raises funds for research into birth defects. Misty Whitchurch, Brett Jackson and Carmen Branch joined me to talk about the work that the March of Dimes does and Misty and Brett both shared their own personal journeys of having premature babies. Misty has two boys who were born pre-mature and Brett has a son who was born pre-mature and both are alive and healthy today thanks to the medical advances that were funded by the March of Dimes. Carmen joined me to talk about how the March of Dimes is spreading the word about the Zika Virus to expectant moms and how the March of Dimes is funding research to combat the virus. We also talked about community initiatives to educate women who are thinking about becoming pregnant or women who are pregnant about prenatal care. Debbie Branch and Raymond Lister with the City of Fort Worth joined me to promote today's 5th Annual Earth Party Celebration in Fort Worth. The event will take place at Magnolia Park in Fort Worth and will feature booths from different companies and organizations that promote environmentally friendly ideas including Tesla and electric cars and Rain Barrel companies that promote water conservation. The event is all about raising awareness about being environmentally friendly and how the City of Fort Worth is doing its part to lower the city's carbon footprint.

Guests: Dr. Leslie Childs a Voice Care Specialist with UT Southwestern Medical Center and Janice Dean a vocal care therapist and Dr. Brian Berryman with Baylor Medical Dallas and with the Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation and Ryan Anthony who has Multiple Myeloma.

Topic: April 16th is World Voice Day which is aimed at raising awareness about the issue of taking care of our vocal chords which can be damaged by the environment, allergies, and overuse. Dr. Childs and Janice Dean joined me to talk about how people can take care of their vocal chords and make sure that they do not damage them permanently. Dr. Childs talked about how many people don't realize the damage they are doing by misusing their vocal chords by speaking incorrectly or overusing their voice. Dr. Brian Berryman and Ryan Anthony joined me to talk about the work that the Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation does to find a cure for Multiple Myeloma a rare cancer of the blood. Ryan Anthony who is battling Multiple Myeloma shared his story with us and talked about the importance of the research and we also promoted the upcoming Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation Walk which will be held in May at Fair Park in Dallas that will raise money for research.

Issues Covered: Economic Issues, Houston and Support for Veterans and Senior Citizens.

Guest: Dennis Luellen the Executive Director for Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas

Topic: The month of April is National Rebuilding Month a time to draw attention to those people in our community who are not able to keep up with repairs on their homes because of their economic situation. Dennis Luellen the Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Greater Dallas joined me to talk about the work that the non-profit does here in our area fixing and remodeling homes for veterans and for senior citizens who are unable to do so themselves. According to Dennis some of the homes need to be outfitted with handicapped ramps and other accessories to make the home more user friendly for the disabled. We also promoted National Rebuilding Day and the need for volunteers on Saturday, April 30th for projects around Dallas helping clean up neighborhoods and fix up homes. The organization also works with the Homes for Heroes program and is currently taking applications from veterans to have their homes remodeled. The projects will begin on September 11th with 60 homes in 60 days for veterans and their families with the project culminating with a project being wrapped up on Veteran's Day.

Guest: Dr. Robert Melilo an Autism Expert who has written the books Autism, Disconnected Kids and Reconnected Kids.

Topic: Dr. Robert Melilo with the Brain Balance Center in Dallas and McKinney joined me to talk about how parents can help their autistic kids. April is Autism Awareness Month and Dr. Melilo joined me to talk about what everyone should know about autism. According to the Centers for Disease Control it is estimated that 1 in 68 children have autism in the US with boys being at higher risk. Dr. Melilo talked about what parents should be on the lookout for with their children when it comes to signs of

autism and what they can do following a diagnosis to help out their child. We talked about nutrition and education programs that can help and also support for families with an autism diagnosis.

May 1, 2016

Issues Covered: Mental Health Issues, Education, Crime and Violence.

Guests: John Dornheim and David Whitley with NAMI Dallas the National Alliance on Mental Illness.

Topic: May is Mental Health Awareness Month and John Dornheim and David Whitley with NAMI joined me to talk about the importance of raising awareness about mental health issues and getting people to think about taking care of their mental health as they do with the physical health and hopefully ending the stigma so that people with mental health issues such as depression or bi-polar disorder will get help and ask people to support them emotionally. David Whitley talked about his own issues with depression and PTSD following his military service and he talked about how it is now his mission to help other veterans who are facing mental health challenges when they come back from war. We talked about educating the public about mental health and educating law enforcement since many of those who are incarcerated are dealing with mental health issues and here in Dallas County the number one provider of mental health care is actually the Dallas County jail. We also promoted the upcoming NAMI Dallas Walk which will be held at Fair Park on May 14th.

Guests: Kathleen LaValle the Executive Director of Dallas CASA and Angela Lewis a volunteer with Dallas CASA.

Topic: Today is Mother's Day and as many of us honor our moms there are many children in our area who are living in foster care because their moms are not equipped to take care of them. May is Foster Care Awareness month and so this morning we highlighted Texas CASA a nonprofit that helps our foster kids. CASA or Court Appointed Special Advocates help children in the foster care system by providing a volunteer who will help that child throughout their tenure in the foster care system. The child works with the foster parents, the school system and the court system. Kathleen LaValle and Angela talked about the work that CASA does and the need for volunteers to help make sure that every foster child gets an advocate. Angela who is a volunteer talked about her own experience and how rewarding it has been to help children here in North Texas.

Scotty Landry and Dolph talked about the tournament and also the great work that Make A Wish does to grant the wishes of children facing life threatening illnesses here in North Texas. Scotty talked about how families can get involved or get help thru Make A Wish and the impact that the wishes have on a family. Alicia Graham Frye, Jennifer Maddox, Christina Binge and Veronica Gardez joined me to talk about the work that Jonathan's Place does to help kids who have been abused or neglected and we highlighted the foster care and adoption services provided by Jonathan's Place. Christina and Veronica who are foster parents shared their own stories of the children they have helped and Veronica talked about adopting two of her foster children.

programs offered by Komen North Texas to those impacted by breast cancer and Melanie Sinclair shared how Komen helped her family during her mother's cancer battle and how important it is to raise money for research.

Brett Gray with the North Texas Food Bank joined me to talk about the issue of summer hunger that is caused by school being out and kids who benefit during the school year from free breakfast and lunch programs going without. We talked about summer food programs and raising awareness about the programs so that no child goes hungry during the summer. We also talked about volunteer opportunities to help out at food pantries and the food bank and the importance of food drives to make sure the food pantries have enough food to deal with the increased demand. We talked about all of the services and programs that the North Texas Food Bank offers to help the needy. Congresswoman Eddie Bernice Johnson of Dallas joined me to talk about programs aimed at curbing gang violence in our community during the summer months and educational opportunities to help kids in the inner city.

Linda and Loretta talked about the work that Carter Blood Care does in our area and encouraged people to donate blood or to hold blood drives at their churches, schools or place of business this summer.

Topic: Today is Father's Day and Paul Gravelly joined me to talk about the work that The Parenting Center in Fort Worth does to help fathers as well as mothers become better parents. Paul spoke of their co-parenting classes that

help parents who are divorced and who may be dealing with issues that are detrimental to the child's welfare because of arguments and using the child as a bargaining chip in the divorce. We also spoke of their HEAL program and their parenting hotline as well as their programs aimed at helping parents of children with physical and developmental disabilities. Doug Watts joined me to talk about dealing with grief in the aftermath of the deadly Orlando, Florida shooting that took place at a gay nightclub last Sunday. We spoke of the best practices when dealing with tragedies and how to cope with grief and tragedy.

Guest: Becky Vance the CEO of Drug Prevention Resources and Jimmy Capra former DEA Dallas and board member of Drug Prevention Resources.

Topic: Yesterday marked the 7th Anniversary of the death of Michael Jackson who died as a result of an accidental drug overdose and so Becky Vance and Jimmy Capra joined me to talk about drug and alcohol prevention and the dangers of abuse and addiction. We spoke of the death of pop star Prince who died in April from an accidental overdose and we spoke of the Opioid Addiction epidemic in this country and what parents of addicts need to know and what addicts themselves need to know about getting help and the long road ahead of them. We also discussed legislation to legalize marijuana and the pros and cons of the legislation and the impact it may have on children. We also talked about the initiatives that Drug Prevention Resources has in place in North Texas to target youth and teach them about drug prevention and dealing with issues that may come up during their adolescent years including bullying, peer pressure, and social media.
