From **July 1, 2016 through Septembr 30, 2016**, WLS-TV aired **16** regularly scheduled local programs dealing with community issues, **342** public service announcements, and a number of special programs. In addition, we aired a variety of health and lifestyle programming on our **Live Well Network** on 7.2 – a single 24/7 over-the-air digital multicast platform. Programs included **We Owe What?** offering guidance on personal and family finances and **Live Big with Ali V**, providing fitness tips and advice about healthy living and eating. The Live Well Channel also aired **10,029** public service announcements. **Windy City Live**, a one-hour daily program showcasing anything and everything Chicago and also offering local news and weather reports, airs Monday-Friday on 7.1, and is rebroadcast daily on 7.2. Also, during this quarter, on the **LAFF Network** on 7.3, the network featured series that serve the educational and informational needs of children 13 to 16 years of age with its program content.

WLS-TV also broadcasts over **41 hours** of local news programs per week.

The ABC Television Network also supplies the station with news, public interest and educational programming, as described in the quarterly report entitled **ABC TELEVISION NETWORK NEWS and PUBLIC AFFAIRS PROGRAMMING** which is filed separately in the public inspection file.

Hosted by Cheryl Burton and Jim Rose, along with contributions from ABC 7's Evelyn Holmes, Terrell Brown, Karen Jordan and Leah Hope. This edition of Heart and Soul spotlights a tour of the Malcolm X City College with its new start of the art "Virtual Hospital" making it the main health care hub teaching facility in Chicago. The artist Christopher Augmon talks about his mentoring of Chicago Youth programs and his new store named CA Fine Jewelry. Crane High School is spotlighted with their focus on the Debate Team. The Little Black Pearl is a non-profit which has a "Wings Design Program" teaching Art, Education, Business and Music. The program takes place in the Michael Jordan store on State Street. "Smile for Nikki" is a mom who lost her only daughter and started a performing arts program in Chicago Heights for children.

Short films made by African Americans that range from comedy to drama and all the shades in-between that are entertaining and socially relevant. The films are the voices and images of contemporary life in the African American community.

BUD BILLIKEN PARADE, Saturday 8/13 at 9:00a-11:30am

ABC 7 Chicago will be the only TV station in town to broadcast the 87th Annual Bud Billiken Parade, LIVE. The Bud Billiken Parade is both the largest African-American parade in the country and one of the city of Chicago's premier back-to-school events. Once again this year, ABC 7 Eyewitness News anchors Cheryl Burton, Jim Rose, and Hosea Sanders will co-host from the broadcast booth capturing all the fun for viewers watching at home. ABC 7 Anchors Terrell Brown and Karen Jordan will also be a part of the festivities, checking out the action along the parade route. The theme for this year's parade is "Uniting the Community through Education for 87 Years." The 2016 parade Grand Marshal is Katherine Y. Branch, director of Special Projects in the Office of Public Engagement and Intergovernmental Affairs at the White House. Also participating in the annual tradition will be members of the ABC 7 Eyewitness News team including Alan Krashesky, Leah Hope, Charles Thomas, Phil Schwarz, with ABC 7 Windy City LIVE co-host, Val Warner, who will ride atop the station's colorful float. Val Warner is this year's honorary Grand Marshal. The Chicago Defender Charities produces the Bud Billiken Parade; ABC 7 is a sponsor and produces the parade broadcast.

THE Ñ BEAT, Saturday 8/20 at 6:00pm-6:30pm with an encore presentation on Sunday 8/21 at 1:30p-2:00pm

Hosted by Stacey Baca with special contributions by ABC 7's Rob Elgas, Michelle Gallardo, John Garcia and Roz Varon. This edition of *THE Ñ BEAT* turns the spotlight on artist Anna Dominguez who does Art With Tape. Also in the art world, Fidel Rodriguez's art work is shown. He is the artist and director of Art Spaces Gallery on the Mag Mile. The restaurant owner/chef of Sol De Mexico, Carlos Tello is also spotlighted.

Getting high school students to continue onto college is a focus for Eric Solorio Academy High School in Gage Park as well as the satellite campus "El Centro" of Northeastern Illinois University. Norwegian American Hospital is highlighted as a medical center which was on the verge of closing its doors 5 years ago, but is now an integral part of Humboldt Park.
